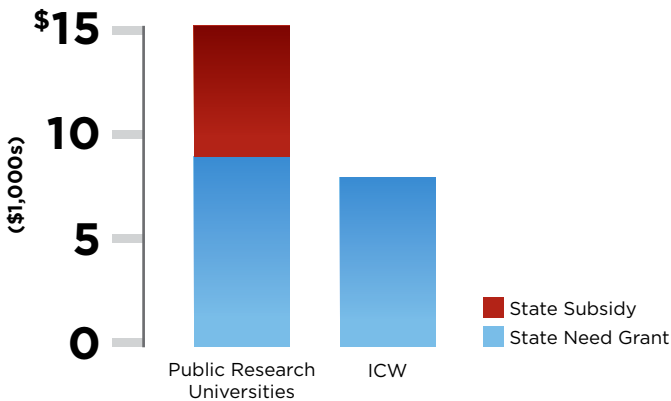

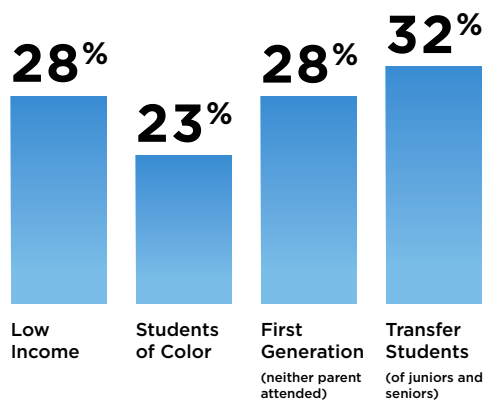

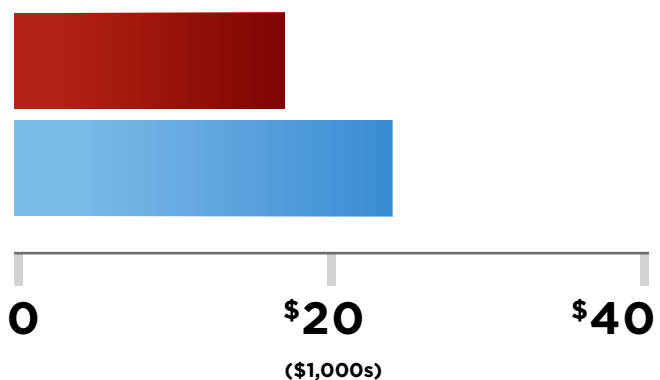
Independent Colleges Serve Diverse Communities

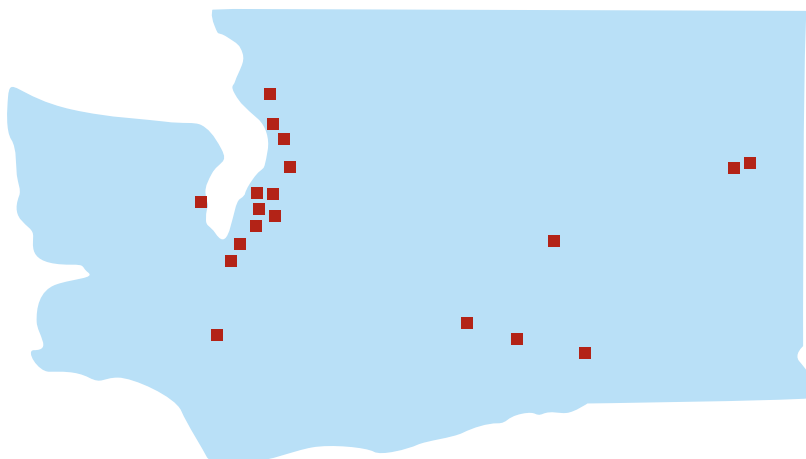

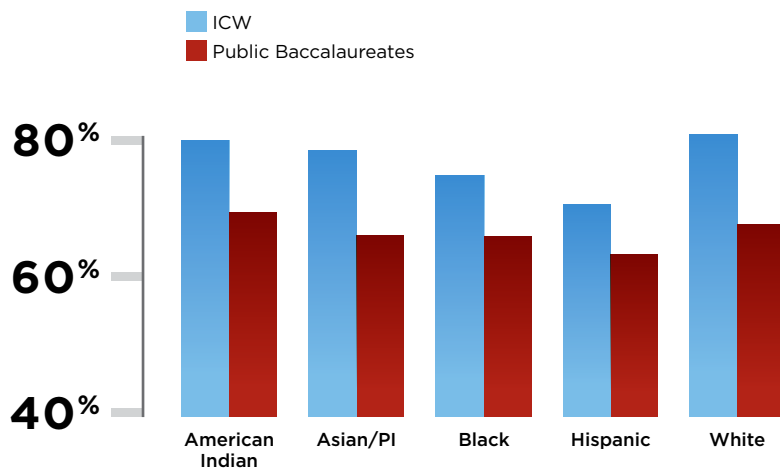

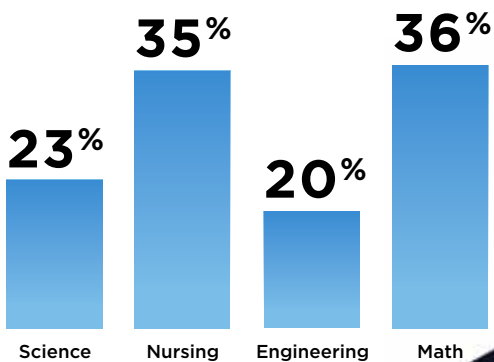
