

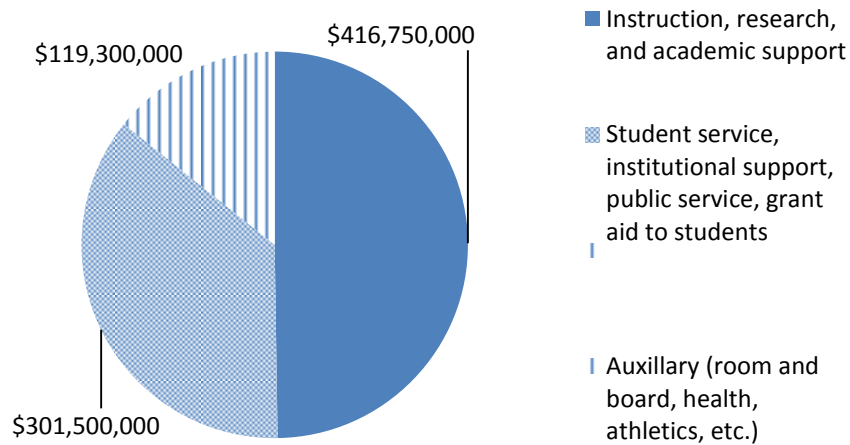


## Economic Impact of the Independent Colleges of Washington

ICW's 10 member colleges and universities **employ over 7,000** and generate nearly **\$2.5 billion** annually in state and local economic activity.

**Nearly 40,000 students enroll at ICW colleges and universities each year** to pursue a wide range of bachelor's, master's, and certificate programs, **conferring one-in-five of Washington's baccalaureate and advanced degrees.**

**15,000 out-of-state students bring more than \$660 million** into Washington's economy each year in direct college and local spending.
